Child-centered play therapy In child-centered therapy, there is as little pre-determined structure as possible in the session (Landreth, 2002) Since the therapeutic relationship itself is the instrument of growth and change, the child-centered play therapist structures only the broadest parameters of the session: 1) a therapy
