What Can Happen to Abused Children When They Grow Up - ...

Predators look for weak or vulnerable people Having been abused as a child – especially having been sexually abused, makes one vulnerable to being revictimized ·Women who are sexually abused during childhood were 24 times more likely to be revictimized as adults as women who were not sexually abused (Wyatt et al, 1992)
